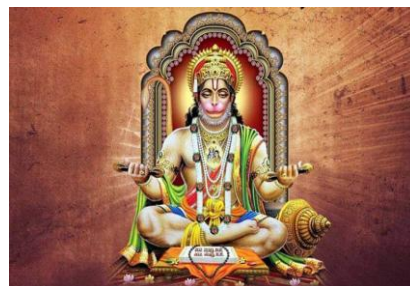

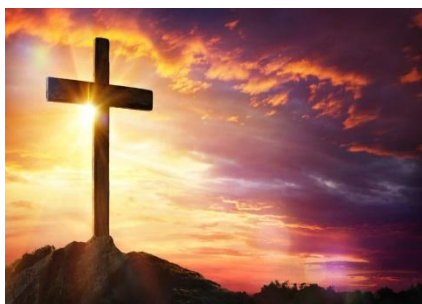

2ND APRIL – HANUMAN JAYANTI

Hanuman Janmotsav, also called Hanuman Jayanti, is a Hindu festival celebrating the birth of the Hindu deity Hanuman, one of the protagonists of the Ramayana and its many versions. Hanuman is regarded to be an ardent devotee of Rama and is widely known for his unflinching devotion. He is worshipped as a deity with the ability to gain victory over evil and provide protection. On this festival, devotees of Hanuman celebrate him and seek his protection, courage, fearlessness and blessings. They join in temples to worship him and present religious offerings.



3RD APRIL – GOOD FRIDAY

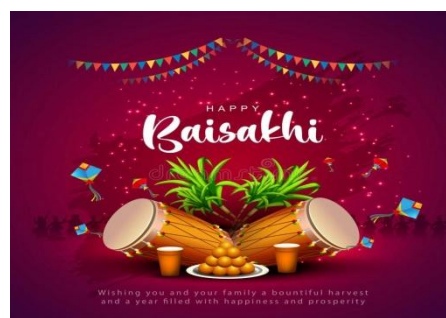


Good Friday is a solemn Christian holiday that commemorates the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ at Calvary. Observed on the Friday before Easter, it marks the climax of Holy Week, honoring Jesus' ultimate sacrifice for humanity's salvation, redemption, and the forgiveness of sins. It remembers the day Jesus was arrested, tried, and crucified, dying for the sins of the world. Despite its sorrowful nature, it is called "Good" because it represents the ultimate sacrifice that led to the resurrection on Easter Sunday, offering hope and eternal life to believers. It is a day of deep reflection, mourning, and prayer

rather than celebration. Many Christians observe it through strict fasting, special church services and abstaining from meat. It serves as a reminder of God's love and the commitment to compassion and forgiveness.

14TH APRIL – BAISAKHI

Baisakhi (or Vaisakhi) is celebrated primarily as a vibrant spring harvest festival in Punjab, signalling the new agricultural year and gratitude for a bountiful harvest. It holds deep significance for Sikhs, commemorating the establishment of the Khalsa Panth by Guru Gobind Singh in 1699, and marks the solar new year. On this day in 1699, Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Sikh Guru, formed the Khalsa—a community of baptized Sikhs committed to fighting injustice and protecting the innocent. It is a time for farmers in Punjab to thank God for the mature rabi crop, signalling



the harvest season. The festival revolves around prosperity, joy, and community bonding. Baisakhi marks the start of the new solar year, specifically in the Punjab region, acting as a new beginning for many.

NEWS HIGHLIGHTS

HISTORY SCRIPTED AS INDIA CAPTURE T20 WORLD CUP CROWN

India defeated New Zealand by 96 runs to become the first team to win back-to-back T20WC titles.



India exorcised the demons of 2023, when they had lost the ODI World Cup final at the very stadium, as they defeated the Black Caps by 96 runs. It culminated a brilliant run at the tournament, as India have lost just one match in the last two T20 World Cups. New Zealand were blown away by the power-packed Indian batting line-up, who posted 255/5, the highest total at a T20 World Cup final. In response, the Black Caps folded at 159 in 19 overs.

The victory ensured India became the first team to defend their T20 World Cup title, the first to triumph at a home

championship, and the first to win three T20 World Cup titles.

Meanwhile, New Zealand suffered their fifth straight defeat, in 11 years, in the final of an ICC white-ball world event.

US-Iran war triggers commercial LPG shortage in India

The conflict in the Middle East has triggered an energy crisis across the world, and India too appears to be bearing the brunt, with reports of a commercial LPG shortage even as the government maintains it has sufficient stock.

The production and supply of energy products, including LPG, have been disrupted due to the ongoing war between the US and Iran.

The crisis has led to a shortage of commercial LPG in the country. In Rajasthan, oil marketing companies have directed distributors to halt new bookings for commercial LPG cylinders.

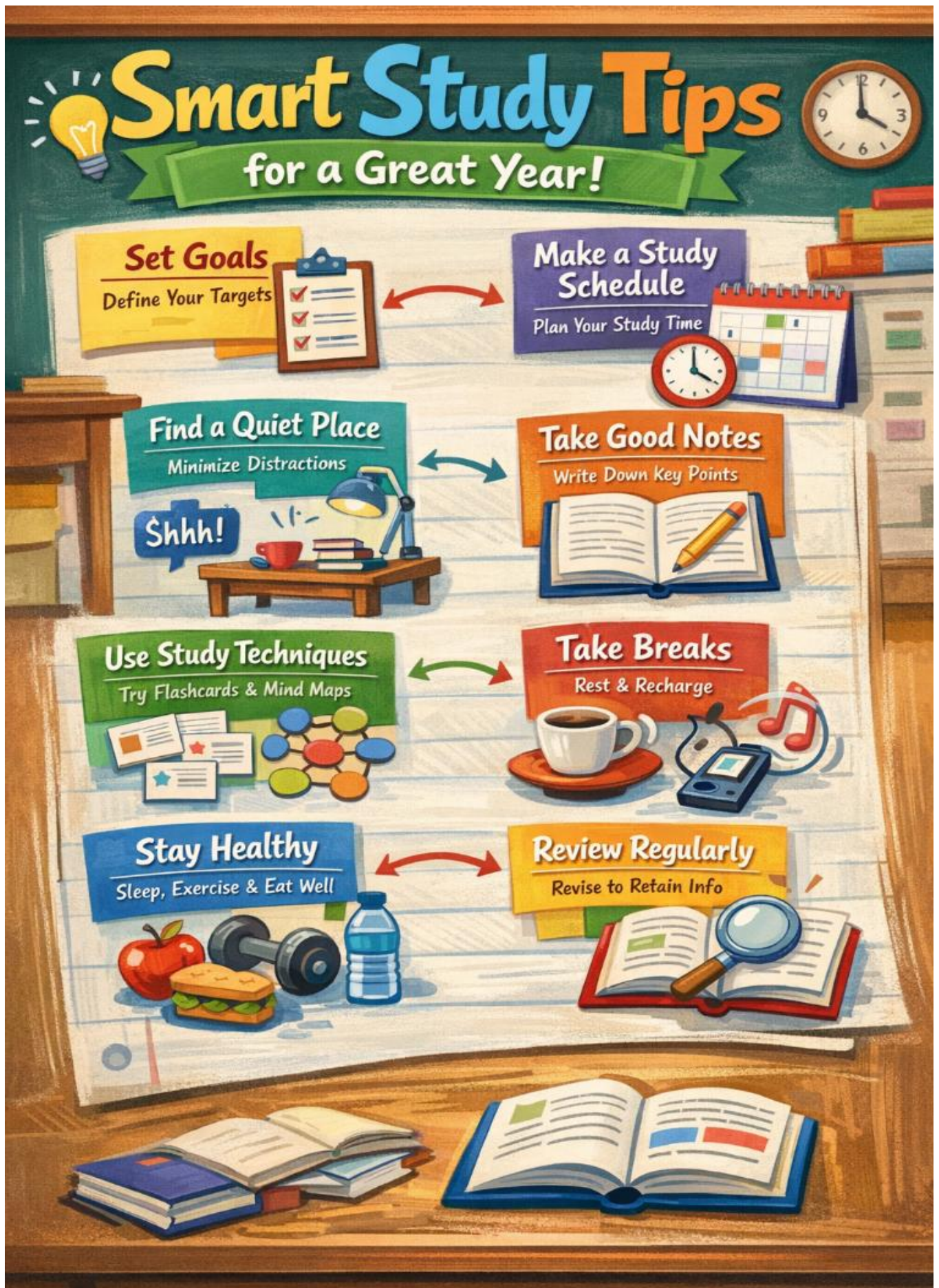


The supply of commercial LPG has also been disrupted in Karnataka, where several hotels, restaurants, and roadside food vendors are on the verge of shutting down their operations.

Amid the crisis, the Hotel and Restaurant Association has raised the alarm, claiming that the shortage of commercial LPG could force around 50 per cent of hotels and restaurants across several cities to shut their operations in two days.

“The shortage of commercial LPG has become extremely serious over the past week, with intermittent disruptions escalating into a near-complete halt in supply in several regions since yesterday,” said Pradeep Shetty, VP, FHRAI & Spokesperson, Hotel and Restaurant Association
