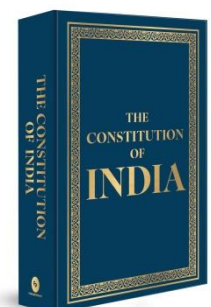
5TH NOV – GURU NANAK JAYANTI



Guru Nanak Jayanti is celebrated to commemorate the birth of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the founder of Sikhism. It is one of the most significant festivals for Sikhs, marked by prayers, processions, and community meals to reflect on his teachings of equality, love, compassion, and selfless service. It is a day to reflect on and celebrate the core values he taught, which include unity, equality, compassion, and honesty. He emphasized that all people are equal before God, regardless of their caste, creed, or gender.

CONSTITUTION OF INDIA

The Constitution of India is the supreme law of the country, adopted on November 26, 1949, and enacted on January 26, 1950. It establishes India as a sovereign, socialist, secular, and democratic republic, outlining the government's structure, powers, and duties while guaranteeing the fundamental rights and duties of its citizens. Key features include a parliamentary system of government, a unique blend of rigidity and flexibility, fundamental rights and duties, and a federal structure with a strong centralizing tendency.



Key aspects of the Indian Constitution

Government structure:

It establishes a federal parliamentary system with a constitutional republic, including a President as the head of state and a Prime Minister leading the cabinet. Power is separated among the executive, legislature, and judiciary.

Fundamental rights and duties:

The constitution guarantees basic rights to all citizens and also outlines their fundamental duties.

Directive Principles:

These are guidelines for the government to follow in order to promote social and economic welfare.

Secular state:

It declares India a secular state, ensuring equal respect and treatment for all religions.

Judiciary:

It establishes an independent judiciary to protect citizens' rights and interpret the Constitution.

Citizenship:

It provides for a single citizenship for all Indians, regardless of their state of origin.

Amendment process:

It includes a mechanism for the constitution to be amended to adapt to changing needs.

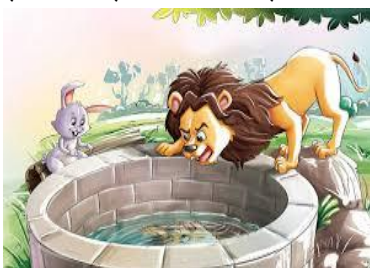

चतुर खरगोश

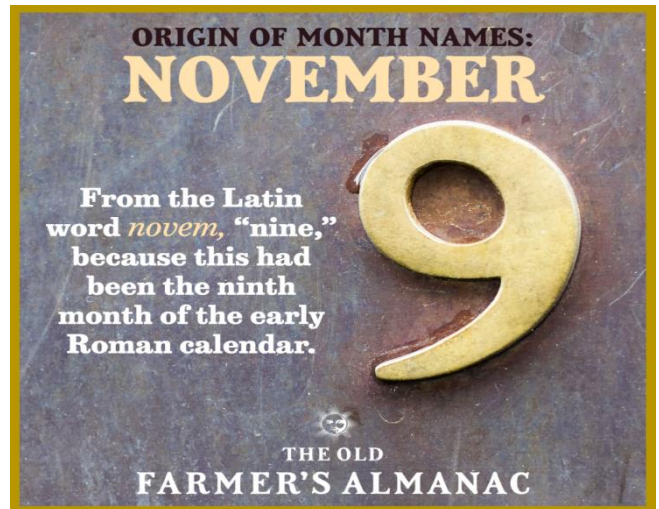

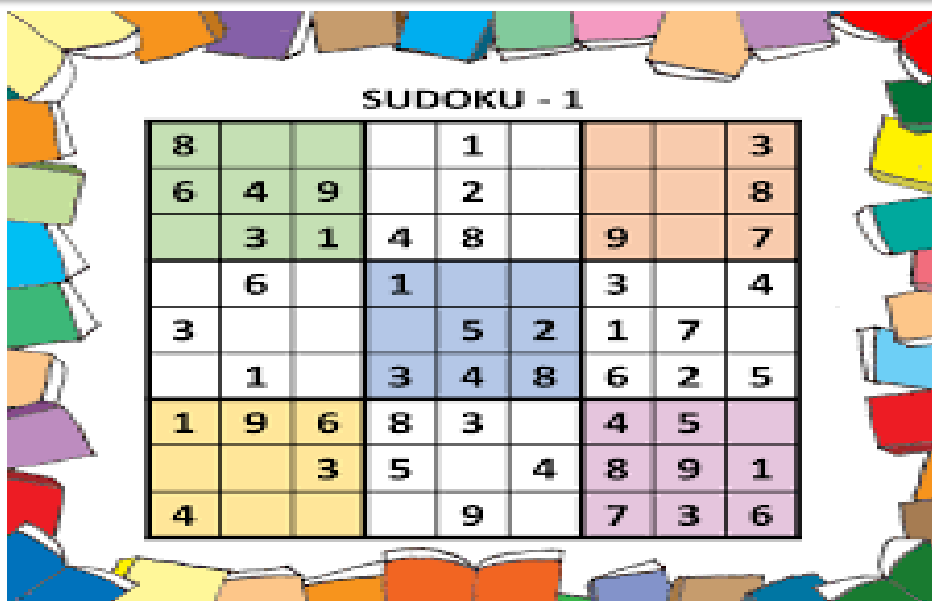
