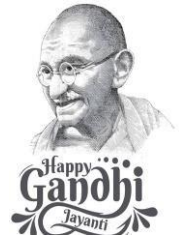

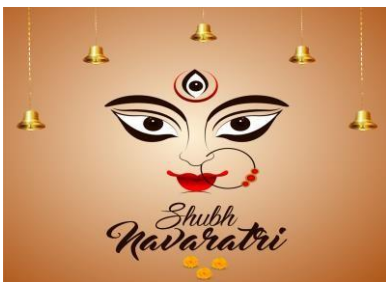
NATIONAL FESTIVALS

2ND OCT – GANDHI JAYANTI

Gandhi Jayanti's importance lies in honoring Mahatma Gandhi, the "Father of the Nation," on his birth anniversary and celebrating his philosophy of non-violence (Ahimsa) and truth (Satya). It serves as an international day of non-violence, encouraging global adherence to peaceful resistance.



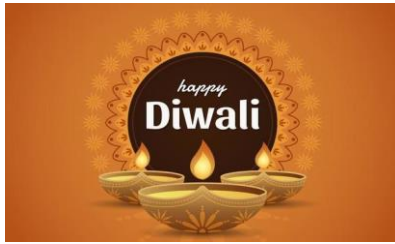
FESTIVALS



The festival's importance lies in promoting spiritual growth, fostering cultural unity through diverse rituals and dances like Garba and Dandiya, and marking the end of the monsoon season with agricultural significance. It emphasizes self-discipline through fasting, honors women's energy and resilience, and serves as a time for introspection and inner transformation.

The festival that directly follows Navratri is Dussehra (also known as Vijayadashami), which marks the triumph of good over evil. Celebrated on the 10th day of the Hindu lunar month of Ashwin, Dussehra signifies the victory of Lord Rama over Ravana and also the Goddess Durga's victory over the demon Mahishasur, concluding the nine-day Navratri period.





Diwali is important as a symbol of the victory of light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance, marked by spiritual renewal, family gatherings, and the worship of deities like Lakshmi and Ganesha for prosperity and success.

It's an opportunity for sisters to pray for their brother's long life and well-being, while brothers pledge to protect and care for their sisters. The festival reinforces sibling unity and offers a dedicated occasion to express affection and strengthen these enduring relationships.

The Boy And The Poor Slave

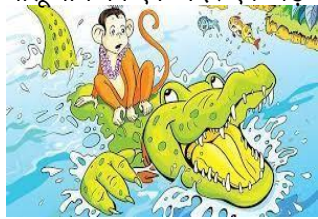
